We don't pretend to know the gravity of the issues you are facing as the U.S. Secretary of Education. But, we cannot remain silent on the actions that are being taken to end the Opportunity Scholarship Program in Washington D.C.


We are not a part of any movement to thwart your efforts or more broadly the overall efforts of President Barack Obama. We applaud him for the courage he is showing by facing up to very difficult problems facing this country and for that he has our support and our appreciation. We are grateful to you for the leadership you are showing in taking a stand against schools that are failing our children, a disproportionate number of whom are poor children of color. Again, we offer our encouragement and our support. But, the fact is the actions to end the Opportunity Scholarship Program are outrageous. This effort flies in the face of the President's promise to end what does not work and keep what does. This is a program that WORKS. It works at two levels: First, it provides a choice for low income and working class parents in Washington D.C. It gives them a small measure of the kind of power that both you and the President are rightfully exercising for your own children. Second, there is evidence that there are children who are benefiting educationally because of the existence of these scholarships.

The one thing we know about both of you is that neither of you are hypocrites. But, by being unwilling to take a strong stand for these children and their families you are allowing yourselves to be placed in that category. It pains us to see you and the President being attacked in this way. But, to be truthful it pains us more to see these children being denied the educational opportunity that the Opportunity Scholarship Program affords them.
