

WELCOME

n behalf of the Board of Directors, the Symposium Planning Committee, and the staff of the Black Alliance for Educational Options (BAEO), we welcome you to Symposium 2005: The Fifth Annual Meeting of the Black Alliance for Educational Options.

Symposium 2005 marks the 5th Anniversary of BAEO. Over the years, national demands for parental choice and quality educational options have increased. Yet, as recent independent studies reveal, the struggle to close the achievement gap for African American children continues.

- Black children continue to lag behind their peers in math and reading achievement.
 - . On the NAEP 8th grade math test, an estimated 6 out of 10 Black students were unable to perform at even a basic level compared to 2 out of 10 white students.
 - . On the NAEP 8th grade reading test, an estimated 5 out of 10 Black students performed below the basic level compared to less than 2 out of 10 White students.
- Black students are less likely to graduate from high school than their White counterparts.
 - For the class of 2002, national averages revealed that 7 out of 10 White students graduated from high school compared to a graduation rate of 5 out of 10 Black students.
- Black students are less likely to attain a college degree than their White counterparts.
 - Four out of 10 Black students starting at a 4-year institution attain a Bachelor's degree compared to a rate of 6 out of 10 for White students.

In five years, BAEO has joined low-income and working class parents from across the country to demand quality educational options and parental choice. To support local and state efforts, BAEO has established a base of 2,000 members. BAEO members look beyond the statistics to see the potential and future of African American children. We stand firm on the belief that "when you give parents a choice, you give children a chance."

This weekend we will pay close attention to the notion of "quality." We will present our *Guiding Principles for Quality Educational Options*, a working draft of BAEO's definition of quality, and request your feedback and recommendations. In addition to defining quality, presentations and workshops will introduce innovations in education that are demonstrating success for parents, students and educators.

Highlights of the weekend include:

- Quality Educational Options School Tours featuring five Detroit area schools led by African American educators who truly believe all children can learn.
- BSLI Pre-Symposium Leadership Program for BAEO leaders seeking to develop their communication, organizational management and personal leadership skills.
- Grassroots Parent Organizing: Keeping Parents Informed and Active
 and Parent Power: Leave No Parent Behind concurrent sessions
 celebrating local campaigns to sustain a base of committed
 parent advocates for the parental choice movement.
- Financing Public Charter Schools, Teacher Empowerment for Student Achievement, School Designs that Work, Mastering Subject Matter...10X10, and Mission Possible concurrent sessions featuring strategies to improve classroom instruction, school design and school financing.
- Stakeholder sessions for clergy, elected officials and emerging leaders to reflect and develop strategies to broaden the base of civic leaders, youth and young adults supporting parental choice.

These features and more will fill the weekend. We must use our time together to reaffirm the BAEO mission and exchange ideas. When the weekend is over, our hope is that you will have gained vital information and skills that you will put to use to support parental choice efforts in your local community.

We hope you will be informed, inspired and empowered by what you experience at Symposium 2005.

BAEO HISTORY

MARCH 1999

First Symposium

Symposium on Educational Options for African Americans, "The Power of Options," hosted by the Institute for the Transformation of Learning at Marquette University in Milwaukee, WI. Approximately 150 individuals attended.

DECEMBER 1999

Founders Meeting

An organizing committee of approximately 50 African Americans who support educational options met at the Mayflower Hotel in Washington, D.C. to establish BAEO as a national organization.

MARCH 2000

Second Annual Symposium

Symposium on Educational Options for African Americans, "Expanding and Enhancing the Options," hosted by the Institute for the Transformation of Learning. More than 350 individuals attended.

National Organizing Meeting

Approximately 90 people met after the Symposium to review the first draft of the bylaws and to elect a president and vice president. Dr. Howard Fuller was elected as the first president Dolores Fridge was elected as the vice-president.

JUNE 2000

First National BAEO Board Meeting

The Board approved a strategic plan, bylaws, and agreed that the Symposia would be BAEO's annual meeting.

AUGUST 2000

The Launch of BAEO

BAEO was launched at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C. The press conference was covered by C-SPAN, and webcast on connective.com.

MARCH 2001

First Chapters

Milwaukee and Denver chapters were authorized.

JULY 2001

National Office

National office relocated to Washington, D.C.

SEPTEMBER 2001

First National Media Campaign

Conducted the All Kids Need Choice media campaign to spotlight our mission.

MARCH 2003

First Public Information Campaigns by Local Chapters

Launched the Parents, You Need to Know public information campaign for Project Clarion to promote Supplemental Services and Public School Choice in Dallas, Detroit, Milwaukee and Philadelphia.

SEPTEMBER 2003

First Satewide Media Campaign

Launched the Step Up for Students media campaign in Florida to inform parents and the community about the Corporate Income Tax Credit program.

First BAEO/Gates Small High Schools

Two BAEO/Gates Small High Schools opened in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

OCTOBER 2003

First Role-A-Like Group Meeting

Approximately 30 clergy attended the first Clergy Roundtable held in Orlando, Florida.

BAEO Today

BAEO has 16 official and two developing chapters in 10 states. BAEO is currently the preeminent national organization for Black people who support parental choice to empower families and increase quality educational options for Black children.

REV. EDDIE EDWARDS TRIBUTE



Reverend Eddie Edwards

(1936-2004)

A Warrior for the Parental Choice Movement

Man of God

Reverend Edwards' faith in God and religious beliefs served as a foundation for his belief in the parental choice movement. Steadfast on the importance of low-income and working class parents to make choices for their children, he worked tirelessly to live his beliefs.

Man of Vision

In 1976, Reverend Edwards established *Joy of Jesus, Inc.* as a ministry and summer camp dedicated to teaching children about God, and providing them with positive moral values and self-worth.

With time, Reverend Edwards expanded his ministry to assist an entire neighborhood. By 2001, he had helped to enliven the Ravendale community in East Detroit. He established a community center, as well as connected churches, schools and neighbors. According to police records, the organization's efforts helped drop crime in the area by 42 percent.

Man of Action

Reverend Edwards was one of the founders of BAEO. He was totally committed to the organization's mission. Reverend Edwards co-convened BAEO's first Clergy Roundtable where leaders from across the country met to discuss how to expand awareness of parental choice.

He was a leader in the effort to get the Michigan constitution changed to allow for vouchers as viable options for parents. When others succumbed to fear and timidity, Rev. Eddie Edwards stood tall as a fighter for parental choice.



THE BAILEY AND SULLIVAN LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

The Bailey and Sullivan Leadership Institute (BSLI) was created in honor of Deirdre Lynn Bailey (1970-2003) and Lisa Yvette Sullivan (1961-2001). In the late 1980s, Lisa and Deirdre were part of a team of New Haven teenagers and young adults who registered African-Americans to vote and organized young volunteers for political campaigns, resulting in the election of New Haven's first black mayor, John Daniels. Deirdre was a high school student at the time and Lisa was a graduate student at Yale University. Their political work and mentorship of young people spanned more than 20 years.

In June 2000, Deirdre and Lisa brought their commitment to youth leadership and political change to BAEO's founding meetings. Alongside elected officials, educators and activists from across the country, Bailey was a founding member of BAEO and was instrumental in launching the Philadelphia BAEO chapter. During founding meetings for BAEO, Lisa facilitated discussion to define BAEO's approach to reaching and supporting emerging leaders, and she advised BAEO through its transition from Milwaukee to Washington, DC.

Deirdre and Lisa's passing in July 2003 and October 2001, respectively, was deeply felt by the leadership and members of BAEO. Spurred on by their example, through the BSLI, BAEO will transform the parental choice movement by developing a cadre of Black leaders with the skills, relationships and knowledge to fight for the academic future of Black children and the empowerment of low-income and working class families.
